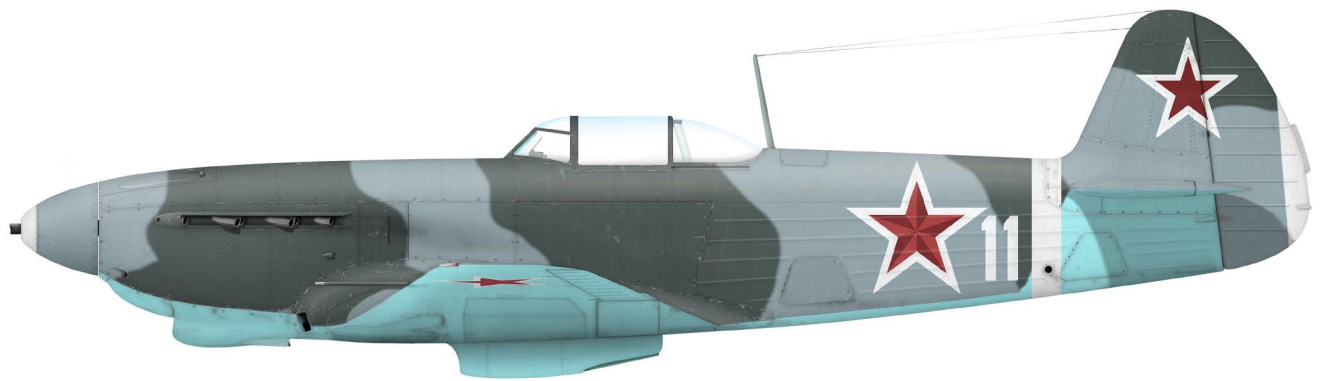

The appearance of "White 15" was classic for this regiment, complete with white spinner and rudder. In this sequence one may see numbers "23", "19", "45" and "49" also in virtually identical schemes.



"White 11" of the 152 GvIAP was photographed on a Czechoslovak aerodrome near Prague at the end of the war, 1945. Many of the aircraft in the regiment were superbly turned out, and indeed "11" was no exception. A white band was worn on the fuselage, and similar trim on the spinner and rudder. The fuselage star had been wonderfully embellished into a 'Kremlin type' marking (with 3D shading), and in general the aircraft looks to have been cleaned up and well cared for.
